#### **Divine Mercy Sunday**

Today, April 27th is Divine Mercy Sunday. This feast is based on the private revelations of St. Faustina Kowalska. In 2000, St. Pope John Paul II canonized Faustina and said, "It is important that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the Word of God on this Second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church will be called Divine Mercy Sunday." The Divine Mercy image is a depiction of Jesus based on a vision that St. Faustina had in 1931. In the image, Jesus is shown as raising his right hand in blessing and pointing with his left hand on his chest, from which flows two rays: one red and one white. Red for the Precious Blood of Jesus and the other for the "Water" which flowed from His Heart on Good Friday. The whole image expresses the charity, forgiveness and love of God, referred to as the "Fountain of Mercy." The words often accompanying this image are "Jesus, I trust in you!" The Chaplet of Divine Mercy has become a powerful prayer for obtaining mercy for oneself, others and the whole world.

#### **Masses for Our Holy Father, Pope Francis**

This coming week, our Catholic Communities of Landeck, Delphos and Spencerville will offer special Holy Masses for the repose of the soul of Our Holy Father, Pope Francis. We encourage you to come and join in prayer with the 1.4 billion Catholics throughout the world who will be entering into a 9-day period of mourning. A Mass for the Dead will be offered for him at the following times and days: Monday-Landeck at 7:00 p.m., Tuesday – Delphos at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday – Spencerville at 6:30 p.m., Thursday and Friday – Delphos at 8:00 a.m.

The Diocese of Toledo is in compliance with the articles of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (Charter) of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). Every year, the Diocese dutifully submits the necessary documentation required by the USCCB for a diocese to be in compliance. Every three years an on-site audit is conducted, when not only all necessary documentation is dutifully submitted, but in addition, Pastoral Center, parish and diocesan school employees are interviewed concerning practices and protocols related to creating and maintaining a safe environment for our children and youth. The last 3-year audit was conducted in September 2024 and all audited Articles within the Charter were found to be compliant. The next on-site audit will be conducted in 2027.

The Diocese of Toledo remains committed to ensuring the tor all young people. If you have any knowledge of abuse

#### (Reflection by Father Jay ~Christ is Risen - He is truly Risen!)

Today we celebrate the last day of the Octave, the eight days following Easter Sunday. Easter is such a big feast that there are eight days in which we celebrate Easter as a solemnity. However, the season of Easter lasts all the way till Pentecost, Easter is a 50-day-long celebration! Why? Because Easter is such an important part of our Faith. The cornerstone truth of our Catholic Faith is that the tomb was empty on Sunday morning.

What exactly is the cornerstone truth? It's more than just the fact that the tomb was empty. It has to do with the significance of the empty tomb. The significance of the empty tomb is that Jesus Christ the Son of God died and in doing so destroyed death and opened the gates of Heaven for our salvation. Heaven was closed off to us because of Adam and Eve's sin. We were unable to enter heaven but because of Christ's Cross, death, and resurrection, Heaven has now been opened to us.

During the Easter Vigil, we sing the *Exsultet* which has a line in it that says "Oh Happy fault of Adam that merited us such a glorious Redeemer" What this line is saying is that this sin of Adam which closed off heaven for us, which has caused every human being to be born with original sin is a GOOD THING! How can this be true? The sin which has passed sin to all mankind is good because through it we have received a redeemer like no other! Through a great sin, God has worked even greater good. We have earned the Son of God as our redeemer! God has taken our place and died for us and brought us to life!

What this means to us today is that God can always bring about life! Often in our sinfulness we feel like we are unworthy or that God could never except us because we are sinful. But the truth of the empty tomb is that God has literally taken the greatest sin and brought about the greatest good from it! He brought about life from death! The sin of Adam merited Jesus as our Redeemer! God can take our own sins and bring about good! So there is no sin that is too great for him! He can make all things new!

This truth of Easter is very much connected to today's feast of Divine Mercy. God's mercy is so great that there is no sin that cannot be overcome by the resurrection! So let us rejoice that we have such a glorious and merciful redeemer! We encourage you all to approach God with a new hope - the hope of the resurrection- that no matter what we have done we can find mercy forgiveness and new life in Jesus Christ! This is the significance of the tomb! This is why the empty tomb is the cornerstone of our Faith.
