Today's Feast of the Epiphany

The Epiphany is the feast of the manifestation of God to humanity. As early as the third century, the eastern Church recognized it as such. Gradually, it came to be known as the Adoration of the Christ Child by the Magi, or Wise Men. Soon these sages were looked upon as The Three Kings. At Christmas, Jesus is shown as man to a few chosen souls. In the feast of the Epiphany, on the other hand, He appears to the whole world as God! The Epiphany is the high point of Christmas. It is the ancient feast of Christ the King. In the words of St. Leo the Great, quoted in today's Office of Readings, "Dear Friends, Let us celebrate with spiritual joy the day of our first harvesting, of the first calling to the Gentiles... This is the day that David prophesied in the psalms, *All the nations of the earth will come and fall down in adoration at your presence, Lord, and glorify your name.* This came to be fulfilled from the time when the star beckoned the three wise men out of their distant country and led them to recognize and adore the King of heaven and earth. The obedience of the star calls us to imitate its humble service: to be servants, as best we can, of the grace that invites all men to find Christ. You must have the same zeal to help one another; then in the kingdom of God, you will shine as children of the light!"
